- March 21, Eagle Creek Logout: Dennis and Leif logged out six logs, more logs were found past the wilderness boundary. Need to repair 4 Mile Bridge.
- March 22, 400 Trail: Leif was honored with the Certificate of Trail Esthetician: He blow dried (blew leaves)
   the trail and groomed it to a spotless condition! Leif did suggest that trail runners should help to clear trail.
- March 22 Snag Creek: Busdriver and Tyler A Studentless work party (Warner Pacific College cancelled) Bus Driver and Tyler worked anyway. Cleared root wad and cleared down logs about 4 hours of work.
- March 22, OSU Tree School: Underbucker Per David Roe there were lots of sign ups and saws donated.

  Trout Creek and worked approx. 3 miles. Got 10 logs. Will attempt to return with bigger crew due to lots of
  trail slough.

• **HUGE** news from Tom Linde: I met today with the FS and they have agreed to put in a stewardship project for the PCT. The project would be funded for 2015 season if it is selected. It would provide \$40,000. to the Forest Youth Success program for work on the PCT. Getting the project selected looks good and I have the County Commissioners and other officials of the county writing letters of support as well as Congresswomen Herara and State reps and senators. Skamania County. Youth and crew leaders under 4-H so they can do campouts. Funding covers paid crew leaders and pays the youth a stipend. **For overnight camping must be 16 years old, must be in Washington and must be close in – 1 hour drive away.**

# **Tom Linde Huge News continued**

- I'm waiting for word on another source of funds for the Forest Youth Success program I have been working on. If it comes through it will mean \$120,000 to the program for this year **2014**. If we get the funding the FYS program will be looking for projects for the crews. So stay tuned if there is a call for projects it will be on short notice.
  - I have worked with these crews extensively in the past. We have done complete tread conditioning, brushing, drainage, bridge construction, new trail construction, retaining structures, turn pikes. The only thing they can't do is operate power equipment. With the 2015 project funding it has to be in Washington and benefit the National Forest. If we get the 2014 funding it still would have to be FS work but we could expand the area of consideration. We would need to be careful since this is a local youth employment program and politically it would be hard for some folks to accept doing work in Oregon or outside the County. However I'm working with the extension agent hoping to expand the program into Klickitat county and making it a joint school disrict program where we could have crews working out of Trout Lake and White Salmon.
- Pig Pen needs coverage for this year's logout on his section. Bill will do northern part logging and brushing. Leif will support John also southern section. John will run his trail to scout it, with Bill's vehicle support.
- Muddy Fork Bridge Update: Geoff Forest Service did environmental study for bridge to be built across muddy fork. Hope project can start 2014.
