- Chris K: Wilderness Stewards are encouraged to do work parties this year. Next one is July 18 somewhere around Ramona. Also, there's graffiti on the rocks in Little Zigzag canyon.
- Kelley: Gorge Maps are done and available (passed some around). Found logs on Roberta's section and Marijke's section. Super busy with career stuff, so can't volunteer as much.

- Steve P: in awe of ex-logger Pig Pen (John Cunningham).
- Leif: 7/9 Sunday Chinook Pass to White Pass.
- Ron: anyone else having vapor lock problems on their Stihl chainsaw? Underbucker: due to quick change to hot weather and using winter fuel blend. Also, there's been some Stihl recalls, might need to have your saw checked.
- Ron (continued) Plan 20 minutes more to get through construction/blasting on Mt Hood. This will be a good huckleberry year. Parking is impossible in the Gorge.
- Tim L: June 20, packed 1200 trout into Cast Lake. Saturday will pack "keepers" to Shell Rock Lake, only a few fish per bag, only about 100 fish total.
- Steve Q: Geocaching in Nevada recently. Thursday, met with Dana, Mark Larabee and and old guy Dan Lauden, who published Trails for America, conceptualizing the national trail system. Also in awe of John Cunningham.
- Carole: scouted her section this afternoon, met some people who wondered if there was a famous trail nearby and thought maybe she was Cheryl. Leaving for Glacier NP next week.
- Lamar: Trail to the top of Punchbowl is opened by users. Two people have broken backs from jumping. Replanked High Bridge.
- Freefall: went to Colorado, nice hike. Saw rangers doing massive campsite decommissioning. Needs B sawyer for his section.
- Pace: big log maybe next month with XC. 4 miles in, 36-42" diameter on steep side slope, will need to be single bucked. It's a challenge, if you're interested let him know. Others suggested maybe Mckenzie should blast it. Might do an overnighter next month to work on wash out area.
- Tyler: Would like a sign-making weekend some time. Would like to figure out a process with Dana and Bill. Went on a logout with 350 Blades 51 trees in 6 days along Vista Ridge at Glacier Peak. Each day was a longer hike. Will be in Alaska in August and Maine in September.
- Roberta: I'll be on vacation July 26-Aug 9 then immediately working on NSM crew on Aug 10.
