Crews and Events since last caretaker meeting:

- 1. June 9 Eagle Creek-7.5 mile camp Scout: Dana, Lamar, Sue B.
- 2. June 9 Timberline Trail, Muddy Fork tread repair and brushing: Pace
 - Pace: We got the last 3 logs that we couldn't get to before because we couldn't cross the river.
- 3. June 10-12: Big Bend TSC/Saw Certs

 - Liz: Did they get put into the box with all the rubbing stuff?

5. June 12: Logout Paradise Park Trail #778: Chris K and Justin

- Chris K: It went real well, logged out more than I thought and I set a pretty ambitious goal 22 logs. All
 crosscut. Almost 10 miles.
 - Roberta: I feel like we are getting more logs and more miles every work party. We are getting more efficient/experienced.

6. June 12: Logout Rd 58 to Little Crater Lake: Steve P

• Steve P: Yes I did multiple parties in there. It was 58 down to 5890 really. There was another one in there somewhere, it's all blurring together. I think about 30 logs in that section.

7. June 12: Log out Lolo Pass to Top Spur (NSM): Worm, Roberta

- Roberta: This is the one where we got Chuck to replace Leif.
 - o Leif: Pam replaced me...no, you're right.
- Roberta: I think we got 4 logs but can't remember

8. June 14: NSM at Bald Mtn: Pace

- Pace: Did some re-benching. Got some snow coming down on us. Month before it was bright and sunny, a month later and it is snowing on us.
- Roberta: You know it's bad when we are trying to finish up benching and the snow is swirling and Pace says we are done at 1:30pm.

9. June 14: Scout Wahtum Lake: Busdriver John

10. June 17: Brushing Ft Raines: Kelley and Leif

Kelley: We got some good work done. Leif is a big help.

11. June 18: Go Beyond Racing at Teakettle Springs: Justin

Roberta: Instead of doing the rigging and cutting, they did the switchbacks.

12. June 18: Logout Big Huckleberry: Marty et al

 Little Brown: We had 2 crews. One from each end. We left 33 logs. Went back later to finish up. It's all done

13. June 18: Logout Little Crater Lake #3: Steve P

• Steve P: So that was HWY 26 down to 240. Mostly small ones, it was relatively easy. There was one 2-footer right at the beginning.

14. June 18: Logout Twin Lakes: Gentleman Bob and Jane

• Bob: It went well. We had 12 people in the rain. We had 3 crosscut crews so we leapfrogged up the trail. There were about 130+ cut-ables. Some relatively small. It was a great crew.

15. June 18: Scouting Table Mtn North End: Freefall

• Freefall: We got a bunch of trees north of Table. Still have logs near the quarry, near 3 Corner Rock. Same place they all fall down every year. I have to find a sawyer to help me out with that

16. June 19: Logout Hwy 26 to Road 240: Steve P

• Steve P: See above. They cut down to here.

17. June 19: Scout Sandy River PCT: Chris K

 Chris K: Had some work for the Wilderness Stewards and double dipped for that one. Ramona falls to the loop. It wasn't too bad. We are supposed to put signs up on the 23rd. It was a very hard day. I also had to pack out 30lbs of trash someone left on the PCT. It wasn't too bad. There were several piles, not sure if they were from the same backpacker.

18. June 19: Scout Sedum Ridge North: Tami

- Tami: I just heard there were 3 down on the other side, Tyler and I had worked that side so I had to go check it out and its fine.
- 19. **June 20**: Freefall: with a FS crew, took out pretty big log laying on the trail. I think of note was being able to work/volunteer with crew lead by Dawn, she wants to be more hands on with working with us. We got 16 logs with her crew that day. Fixed some of the slides. Dawn took pics so we can look at what we need to do. There is another area that had collapsed out right near where my section begins. Got a lot in Kelley's section that were laying down and did a bunch of brushing.

20. June 20: Logout Benson Plateau: Roberta

 Roberta: Justin said there were 5 logs and it was easy. More had come down before we went out. We didn't finish, 2 stepovers left.

21. June 21: PCT Muddy Fork brushing and drainage: Pace

 Pace: Got back down on the main PCT section. Spent the next day cleaning up the bushes. Cleaned up the river crossing. It was a good day.

22. June 24-26: Lemiti Logout: Underbucker et al. 500 log out

Dave: A lot of logs. We had 3 days. Fortunately, few logs were large or complex and we had 6 sawyers.
 Walk, cut, walk, and cut.

- o Roberta: I heard there were some cut, step over, swampers pull out.
- Tyler: Marty and I force walked a new couple down to Jude lake. They wanted to turn around but I told them its 8 miles back or 2 miles forward. I'm hoping that couple come back, he seemed excited but she blew out her feet. Good fun day.
- David: We used 2.25 gallons of fuel.

23. June 24: Scouting WA Side Gorge: Dana and Dawn

- Roberta: They were scouting for the Skyline crew.
 - o Tami: Which section?
 - o Freefall: They are working in my section.

24. June 25: Logout Top Spur North with NSM: Worm, Pace, Roberta

- Pace: Rolled a bunch of logs off the trail.
- Roberta: One of the logs had been there for years. It was starting to encroach on the trail and by cutting some stuff we were able to roll it off.

25. June 27: NSM at 3 Corner Rock: Kim and Pam

Roberta: Heard it went well and they had a good time but it got really hot.

26. June 28-29: Steamboat Logout: Tyler

Tyler: So over the last 2 years, it has been less than 40 logs in 15 miles. You just take a chainsaw and scout/cut at the same time. We go up to RD 23, and there are 61 logs. It took 5 hours for a mile and a half. On the 2nd day, counted 98 more logs but I ran out of gas. That took another 5 hours. One was a 32" log laying 3 feet off the ground and I didn't know how to cut it. I told Dean about it and he logged out to RD 24.

27. June 28: Upper Muddy Fork brushing, tread repair and drainage: Pace

Pace: We went from Bald Mt to the river. Cleaned the inside drains and brushing.

28. June 29: Logout Timberline South: Ron

- Ron: You could set the paper on the hood of the car and there was no wind to blow it away. Got some big noble fir down on the lower end. Leif was nice and came up to take care of those. There is a point in the day that even if there are a couple more left, you have to call it a day. It's nice that Leif jumps in to help with those. There were 2 new people and a cross cut team, it took them quite a while, one logs was a real tough one that didn't want to cut
 - o Little Brown: It was 16" but burned in a fire and really hard.
- Ron: They didn't make it to lunch with us. Nice of the power line crew to cut a big tree and leave it on the trail and left their tackle too. The tree is perfectly across the trail

29. July 1-2: Logout Indian Heaven South: Roberta, Tyler, Pace, Marty, Little Brown

- Tami: Did you get eaten alive?
- Roberta: It was a 3 bar Tyler day.
- Tyler: It was 4. I had a weird tree. It didn't look too bad. I went to get the 25" from the BOG cache. It had the 20" bar on it. The tree had a little bit of side bind, I thought. I cut it and it moved. I didn't have an axe, had to hike back out to get more bars, and an axe. I thought about leaving but it was almost cut so I thought I should just get it. I made a cut and it moved. Now I have 2 bars stuck in. Bob, the new guy, this was his first crew, explaining that this isn't what we normally do. We wound up hacking the 2 bars out. There were 4 binds in it. It was a good day, went clear up to the Wilderness boundary.
- Roberta: Pace and Marty were cross cut team from the other end. I was camp tender so I got to hang out in camp
- Liz: (To Tyler) Do you get a prize for that?
 - o Ron: The annual meeting is coming up.
 - o Leif: The Golden Bar award.

30. July 1-4: Warm Springs Logout: Becky

- Becky: We got it done. With Tim's help and several other equestrians. It was all done for the race this last week. Dave did more miles than we did but the total log count from Joe Graham horse camp to Breitenbush was 904 logs.
 - o Roberta: Remember a couple years ago we were thrilled when we hit 1000 logs in a season.
- Becky: There were 30 on Tim's section we could add
 - o Tim: There were 4 more on your section.
- Becky: I don't normally go to Triangle so I asked the people that are normally there. They said they were getting more trees in ½ hour than all day. Had a couple people go back out to finish Lodgepole Trail. Need to know who I contact at Clackamas to let them know it is done.
 - Roberta: Tom Triscik and Mark Engler
- Becky: Tami found a plugged French drain, I got it drained off. I think it needs work but I don't know how
 to fix. It is draining but not draining through the middle. Dave was thinking the Skyline crew could do it. It
 is right on the trail. Really beautiful French drain.
 - o Dave: Those drains are supposed to be covered with drain cloth.
 - Becky: There was still so much water so I couldn't see down to see if it was blocked. Not too far in.

- o Roberta: Dana's preference is open culvert over a French drain.
- o David: Do you want to work it out with Dana or do you want me too?
 - Becky: I'll let you do it. If she wants more specifics (it is about a 1 2 miles north of Jude Lake).
- 31. July 1: Olallie Logout: Jerry
 - Jerry: 55 logs last weekend with Becky.
- 32. July 2: Timberline North logout: Ruth
 - Ruth: I had a crew, old ladies, we did 2 miles from Timberline with inexperienced people. Had a great time.
- 33. July 2: Wahtum Lake logout: Busdriver John
 - Roberta: Kim and Pam went as well
- 34. **July 4**: Chris K: I scouted the 4th and 5th upper 778 and the whole loop. There is 1 log down on the loop, it's about 15", right near the junction, a few hundred feet from the eastern 757/PCT junction. So it's only 200 feet up that trail. Try to organize a crew for the 30th or 31st. I've got to finish the last part. Nothing on the upper 778. So all I have to do is finish what I scouted last time, 4.25-5 miles up there, and then another half mile to get that 15" too. Kim, Pam, Justin and I did more logs last year. I'm hoping to get 3 people because it will be a hard day. We drove the crew really hard the last crew. I only need one other sawyer, it would be nice if all 3 people were sawyers.
- 35. July 7: Upper Muddy Fork washout repair: Pace
 - Pace: Across river to Yocum Ridge. Wanted to clear 3 spots that covered the trail. It was a small crew so
 we only worked on 1. There was a big root wad blocking the flow and blocking up the trail. There are 2
 more areas to work on in the next month or so
- 36. July 8: Indian Heaven North logout: Rick
 - Rick: I delegated that to Leif.
 - Leif: There were 33 logs. I was too tired. Just over a 1.5mile. I worked morning to late afternoon and then
 freelanced somewhere else. If you move call dispatch and let them know you are relocating, not signing
 out.
 - Steve P: I had a big 26"
 - Ron: Up the trail another 30 feet is another big one. I think it's the biggest one on Mt Hood.
 - Leif: I scouted Indian Springs Tr, cleared 2 logs, but I went down to Eagle Creek and back up and scouted 16 on the upper part and 1 in the air that is a little precarious and big that I have pics of. My section from wilderness to Indian Springs is clear. It just needs brushing. Camped there. 33 logs the next day on Buck Peak. Doing that next week.
 - o Roberta: I'm a little confused on your reports as to where to allocate everything.
 - o Leif: So am I.
- 37. July 8: Gateway to Mt Adams Logout: Leif and Jane and Bob
- 38. July 9: Warm Springs logout: Becky
- 39. July 9-10: Logout Timberline to Ramona Falls: Ruth
- 40. July 9: Lolo Pass North logout: Leif
 - Leif: 4.4 miles covered. I didn't get rained on.
- 41. July 9-10 Ruth: cleared Zig Zag to Ramona Falls. It was fun. No snow. Wasn't that cold.
 - Roberta: We got rained on at night.
- 42. July 10: Lost Lake to Buck Peak logout: Leif
 - Leif: 25 logs. Huckleberry Mt trail is clear 1.5miles. There were a couple of doozies.
 - Little Brown: There are a couple of really good ones left. I left 2 in the air for Leif.
- 43. July 12: NSM near Gillette Lake: Kelley
 - Kelley: Was it yesterday? It was fun. Glad for Roberta's help. They had a good time. Got a lot of poison oak out.
 - o Roberta: I think I have some on my chin.
 - Kelley: There was one log, they were so excited. They all took turns on the one log.
- 44. July 13: Today's caretaker meeting
 - Becky: It was very heartwarming, every single hiker kept saying how appreciative they were about our
 work. It felt good to say from here north it will be clear. It was a good feeling for us. So many of them can't
 believe we are volunteers and that we don't get paid. They have no idea who keeps the trails clear. It was
 amazing.

• Roberta: We still have money.

Tools: Leif

- Leif: We got them
- Roberta: We're breaking them
- Leif: I've noticed that people are using axes with sheaths on to bang away at stuff. Make sure we take of the sheath.
- Roberta: We have a broken katanaboy. The pin is broken.
 - Leif: Remember to use it in a circular motion.
 - Pace: It's the pin
 - Little Brown: The pin is supposed to be pushed in but it has come loose so it hangs out. The
 riveted end.
 - Leif: I'll go over tomorrow.
- Roberta: I got word another aux handle/stinger is on the way
 - o Leif: We had one at the Portland cache. We need at least 1 at every cache.
 - o Roberta: I'd like one for every "D" handle. Portland cache has 2 "D" handles.
- Leif: Sometime, we'll get diesel fuel at each cache. I have 8 squirt bottles. Don't lay it on like mustard, dribble it on. It is biodiesel. Tools love it. I'm trying to keep up on who has fuel and who doesn't. Dave looks after the southern cache. Portland is good. If you're going to Trout Lake or Wind River, I don't know. Jerry brings his own. If someone is needing to do logouts and needs chainsaws we can figure it out. For the most part, we don't need a lot of fuel out there.
- Bob: Tyler said rumor has it Trout Lake cross cuts are being sharpened?
 - o Dave: They are in my shop.
- Roberta: BOG and Wind River caches are being used for Skyline crews. I may get some tools from David for Danner, not sure if I have enough.
 - Leif: Let me know, I'll be going down there to pick up tools and can pick up whatever Roberta needs.
